Welcome to the Year of our Lord 2024! In this new year, I announce our Synod themes for the next three years,

Seed Sowers:

2024: I Planted
2025: Apollos Watered
2026: God gave the Growth

Last year at Synod Assembly, Seed Sowers was the theme for our inaugural Seed Sowers Luncheon that thanked people who had made a planned gift (meaning that they remembered NGLS/ELCA in their will) or were considering doing so. In essence, they were a "Seed Sower," planting seeds for future ministry, seeds that they knew they would not see grow and bear fruit.

Worship and Music: No report. Next meeting is October 19, 2023 at 6.00PM. Choir practice is October 18 6:00PM.


Ben made a motion to accept the committee reports including the Pastors Report and the Financial reports. Ken seconded. Motion Carried.


