### from Luke 10

Jesus said to them, "Take the cloth off of him and let him go."

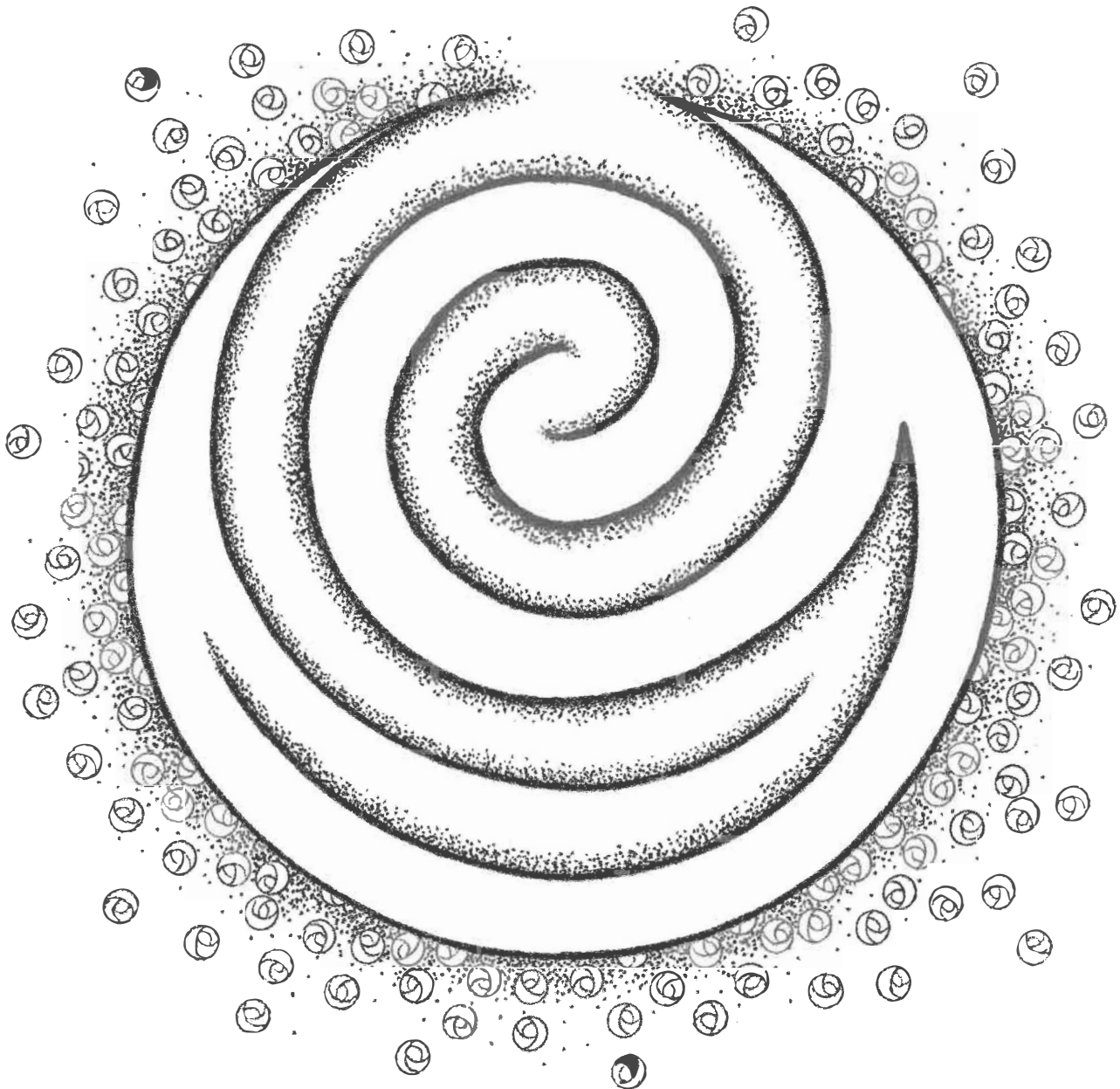
# Labyrinth
