Dear New Hope and Little Elk Creek,

On the third Sunday of May, we will celebrate both Rogation Sunday and Pentecost Sunday. I have known about Pentecost since I was in Sunday school, but Rogation Sunday was new to me when I moved here. I had never been part of a rural congregation. The word "rogation" comes from the Latin "rogare" which means "to ask." On Rogation Sunday we will ask God to bless the land, give favorable weather for crops, and to provide an abundant harvest. We thank God for creation and the people who work the land to provide our food. We pray for the needs of all people, for the safety of farm workers, and the well-being of our animals. We pray that we will be good stewards of the earth. Rogation days are an ancient tradition that goes back as far as 470 AD. In some places, the celebra-

tions were elaborate and had processions going from the church to and around the fields asking for God's blessing on the crops. We will not process out into the fields, but we are encouraging people to bring their tractors to church for a blessing. We will do this outside at the beginning of the service at New Hope at 9 and Little Elk Creek at 10:30.



We finished our meeting anyway and a motion was made to ask Little Elk Creek's council if we can skip the joint meeting and meet again in September as scheduled. The motion passed unanimously.
