Pastor's Reflections

OK, it's a little long this month, but there's a LOT in there!



The pandemic continues...is worsening...and affecting lots of lives, including ours. Like so many we have a personal stake in this, not just as pastors, but as parents. More on that in a moment.

But first...let's go back a few years...in 1527 the plague, the scourge of medieval Europe, killing 30-60% of the population over two centuries, made a return to Wittenberg, the home of Martin Luther. What was Luther's response?

"I shall ask God mercifully to protect us. Then I shall fumigate, help purify the air, administer medicine and take it. I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order not to become contaminated and thus perchance inflict and pollute others and so cause their death as a result of my negligence.

If God should wish to take me, he will surely find me, and I have done what he has expected of me and so I am not responsible for either my own death or the death of others.

If my neighbor needs me however I shall not avoid place or person but will go freely as stated above. See this is such a Godfearing faith because it is neither brash nor foolhardy and does not tempt God."

"Whether One May Flee From a Deadly Plague," Luther's Works 43:132.

Now, truth be told, Luther did not attend our last Council meeting, but Luther's spirit certainly did! That is what we are about, and will continue to be about. Especially as we ponder the resumption of worship and opening of the church building.

To be clear, we are still worshiping! How?

- Drive-way communion hey, this has been fun! We have had (as I write this) nine "DWCs", with over 80 folks in attendance. We have stayed appropriately distanced, and have had some good conversation and reconnecting. Even some new members! More information on the Covid-19 Response page on our web site.
- And soon...here's a tease...we will have a new worship opportunity beginning in August, so watch the August newsletter!

But don't we all just want to get together? Why can't we do that? Why can't we let people decide the risks they are willing to take, and just go ahead?

We can't because this isn't about people taking risks. It's about the others in our community. That is to say, we do what we need to do, not so much to protect ourselves, as to protect the others around us, and in that way, to be a gift to the community.

That's also why we wear masks. Not because the mask will protect me (the wearer – it only does that a bit), but because the mask protects those around me.

But wait? I'm not sick!

Are you sure? Are you sure you are not asymptomatic? As I write this, just this morning news of a new estimate that millions have been exposed and are asymptomatic. And if that is you, without a mask on, and coming to worship, do you generously share your virus with those around you, adding to the spread that eventually hits someone who is vulnerable – and maybe costs a life?

Oops!

We also hear the advice of medical professionals, that this is not the time to be in groups. This is not the time to relax, or ease up. And that is Luther's point. We listen to those who have the expertise, we follow best practices, and we do it for the sake of our neighbors and community. In true "Luther-ish" fashion, isn't that what Our Savior's has always done? Endowment Fund, Feed Our Children, youth ministry programs, Norwegian Dinner, support of missions, hunger relief, and campus ministry – all ways we have done things...for the sake of the community and others!

So then, what is the plan for worship and building re-opening?

The Congregation Council is relying on the La Crosse County Health Department, and it's "Covid-19 Compass Dashboard" (https://lacrossecounty.org/covid19compass.)

After significant deliberation the Council has determined that worship in the building will not resume as long as we remain in the "severe risk" category, as we are at the current moment. When the Compass moves to "moderate risk," we will reassess and consider how we can safely resume worship together. Until then, we will continue to offer online worship and other ministries via technology. The Council has also developed a plan to reopen the building for worship when the time comes.

In addition, the building remains closed at this time. Access will be limited and at the pastors' discretion, though Feed Our Children and the Food Pantry will continue to operate. Face masks will be required for those entering the building.

Office staff continues to be present during most normal office hours, so we can always take your phone calls – in fact, we welcome them!

Yet, while the building is closed, the church remains at work. We have online worship (also available on DVD), a children's message, "Summer Sunday School," Bible study, phone calls, emails, cards to connect us, outdoor "driveway communion," and lots of planning for the fall.

We yearn to be together, but for the moment we cannot. *Please know that we pray for you, and the pastors remain available by phone, e-mail, and other means.*

We thank you for your patience, understanding, and support during difficult times. We are especially thankful for all who have shared financial gifts with us. YOU are allowing us to continue to do ministry in a very difficult time. Your gifts are important – and they make you not only a gift to us, but especially to those whose lives are changed by the work we share together.

Whew! That's a lot, I know, but it's important stuff. Thank you for wading through it all!

Now, to a personal note. Like so many others, our family has been impacted – Rebecca graduates this year, but alas, no graduation party! We had hoped in May...then in July...to have a party at church, and invite you to share in our joy. You have been a big part of her life, and we are thankful to you for your embrace of us and her over the past years. So many of you have made a difference to her!

However ... not to be! So, like all the other grads, please keep her in your prayers during these times of "non-milestones." But...next school year she will participate in "Project Search" at Gundersen, and at the end of the year, will graduate from that program. Maybe by then we can gather...and gather you with us to thank you for your presence in her life and ours.

So, we continue to move forward in faith, as faithful disciples of Jesus, in a troubled and uncertain world. Know that God's gifts of life continue to feed and nurture you, and that through the embrace of Jesus, "God's got your back!"

And remember that we pray for you!

And ... if you have others in your neighborhood – members of Our Savior's or just those who you know are disconnected these days, they could join us, also safely distanced. Wouldn't it be just wild to have two or three family groups, all safely distanced, sharing in God's gifts of grace?

We think this will be a way to connect, even briefly, and share the sacrament with you. Maybe even a few minutes of conversation (we really do miss you all!).

The Feed Our Children Summer lunch program has reinvented itself this year with additional considerations for

everyone's health and safety, this includes mask wearing as well as limited contact drive up service or delivery. In the month of June, we served 302 lunches and provided 62 bags of groceries!

We are extremely thankful for continued support from the members of OSLC as well as the surrounding community. We continue to receive monetary donations which has been incredibly helpful. We use these dollars to purchase items locally. We also continue to use the large donation of food storage containers that we received in March. In fact, we had so many that we were able to share with the West Salem School's Food Service Staff at a time when purchasing paper products (March/April) was extremely difficult.

Stewardship for All Seasons Update

Last fall we brought a challenge to the congregation for 2020 – could we do three things?

- 1. Maintain our ministry excellence.
- 2. Increase staffing dedicated to youth ministry.
- 3. Begin a Wednesday worship, with a much different style and music. A worship not at all like the weekend!

So, what happened? First, we have worked to maintain ministry excellence. We did that by increasing salaries that had not received increases in several years. We also restored cuts that had been made to our mission support. We got off to a great start this year!

Then came COVID. And we were forced to pivot. But remember, we are also working on being an "agile" church, and an "agile" church is able to change to meet new needs in a changing world.

So...at the moment youth ministry (as it is traditionally done) needs to change. And it will. We are working on that!

And a Wednesday worship will probably happen when we can again worship together, but a new music style may have to wait until we can do it right.

Yet, new and innovative worship is still on course. Watch for a new worship in August. Maybe not the worship we wanted or envisioned, but remember? We are "agile." It will be worship that will fit our moment in time.

And then? We are beginning to look ahead to 2021, seeking to discern the new ministries and new directions God calls us to embrace. While we are not sure yet what that will look like, we do know that in the end it's not up to COVID – it's up to the Holy Spirit. The Spirit will guide us and get us moving.

And really, would we have it any other way?



Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, June 8, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in study and prayers based on Galatians 3:27-28.
- Approved the minutes of the May 18 Council Meeting, and received the May financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries.
- Heard that Pastor Jon is working with Jim Anderson on the PPP Grant, and that most likely the entire amount will be a grant, with no balance as a loan.
- Discussed staffing and payroll through the summer, with the
 desire to maintain payroll as much as possible. Pastor Jon
 reported that most employees are working close to full hours,
 and that financially we are in a position to meet that payroll.
- Discussed at length the parameters for re-opening the building and resuming in-person worship.
- Decided to shift to using the LaCrosse County Health Department COVID-19 Dashboard Compass as our guide for re-opening, rather than Badger Bounce Back.
- Discussed, developed, and adopted a plan for re-opening the building and resuming worship.
- Discussed forming a task force to address details in resuming worship, and directing the Worship Committee to design a worship experience.
- Directed the pastors to send out a letter to the congregation prior to the newsletter informing them of the current plans.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, July 13th at 7 PM via Zoom. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Steve Ahles or one of the pastors.
