# Pastor's Reflections



The “dog days of summer” are here, and ... more of the same! BUT ... *new things are happening*. So, I'll update our ministries in a moment, but first ... new stuff!

When we gather in worship (you know, like it seems, years ago!), we usually gathered around God's Word both spoken (Bible readings and sermon) and visible (Holy Communion). These days those things are harder to come by.

Of course, our worship videos on YouTube have shared the spoken Word, and driveway communion has shared the visible word, but let's face it – driveways aren't quite as attractive in January, and if this continues ...

So, what to do? Recently, Bishop Arends has authorized us to offer some form of online, or “virtual” communion experience, until such time as regular, in person worship, is again feasible. In light of the Bishop's authorization, and after considerable discussion, Pastor Jean and I, along with Congregation Council, have decided to move ahead.

You need to know that we have spent long hours discussing, pondering, and even (dare I say) praying about it. Holy Communion is the community gathered together, around the presence of Jesus in the bread and wine. We hear the promises of God, and as a community we receive those promises, sharing them with each other, and then with the world around us. To do that on the internet? Hmm ... not sure about that!

On the other hand ... there comes a moment when we recognize that the box we are in needs to be broken, and then we realize that it is God breaking the box. This is that moment!

And so, with just a wee bit of uncertainty (after all, we've never done this before), we have embraced the opportunity to offer Holy Communion, the presence of Jesus in bread and wine, to you in a

new and different way. Not just for the sake of being different, but because this moment calls forth God's creative work in our midst. And right now, that is what we desperately need!

So, here's what's on tap ... ***Zoom Communion!***

Starting August 9, on Sunday's at 10:30 a.m., we invite you to "zoom" with us (connection info is below). Our worship will be on the "Zoom" internet platform, which allows you to see and hear us, and we to see and hear you, while you remain in your own home. Up to 100 viewers can be on at a time. The worship will last 20-25 minutes, and will include prayer, scripture, and the celebration of Holy Communion.

We offer this with the confidence that God understands our world better than we do, and that the God who would do anything to bring us life (like send Jesus to the cross) is just fine with "breaking the box" and inviting us to a supper where we dine together, but for the sake of the community, cannot be in the same space. Besides, the internet too is God's creation – why shouldn't God use it to make life happen?

So how does this all work? First, you need a camera and mic on your computer, and the connection info below. You can also phone in like a conference call if that works better for you.

Here's what you need to know:

- We meet on Sundays, at 10:30 AM, beginning August 9. Expect 20-25 minutes.
- Have bread and wine (or grape juice) handy. How about baking your own communion bread, using a tried and true recipe? Go to [www.oursaviorswestsalem.org/worship](http://www.oursaviorswestsalem.org/worship).
- We ask you to mute your microphone, but be prepared to submit prayer concerns through the "chat" function. (We'll teach you how to do that!)
- As the service unfolds we will walk you through what you need to know, and when you need to do things.
- The service will be live, and will *not* be recorded.

- We hope to offer a second service (maybe Wednesday evenings?) beginning in September.

We encourage you to give this a try – and if you have concerns, please contact us. We are eager to listen, share, and process this with you, especially as it challenges “what we have always done.”

How to connect to the Zoom worship?

- I can send you an easy link – email me and I’ll send it on to you. Or you can find it on the front page of the web site.
- Or ... go to [www.zoom.us](http://www.zoom.us). You may need to download some software, or just use it off your browser. Once there, click on “join a meeting.” You will need the meeting ID (819 5665 1326) and the password (863077).
- Or ... dial in using your phone. Call 312 626 6799, and use the ID and password above. You won’t see us, but you can hear us!

Yes, these are strange and challenging days, and “Zoom Communion” adds to the changes in our world. But remember, God is still with us, and not even Covid can change that!

Meanwhile, as our world has changed, we have lost a few things. There will be no Corn Roast or Gospel on the Green this year, and as I doubt we will worship together anytime soon, no choir, no SOS Band, and no kids sharing music in church.

Looking further down the road, it’s hard at this moment to see a Norwegian Dinner, or even, dare I say, Christmas Eve worship? What? No Christmas worship? Maybe not.

Yes, these are tough times. But God is still at work, we are still the church, and our mission in the world still remains.

So, just what’s happening these days? Plenty!

**Worship** continues to happen via YouTube, DVDs, Driveway Communion, and now ... Zoom!

**Education** will be challenging this fall, both for Sunday School and Confirmation, but we are working on it. Perhaps not in person, but faith will be shared.

And **Bible study** continues ... Wednesday and Sunday mornings ...

**Pastoral Care** is happening by phone calls, e-mails, cards, and the conversations when we do driveway communions. And we are praying – our prayer team is busy at work, and each day a designated pray-er is busy at 11:45 AM with the bell rung at that time, and the Prayer Labyrinth is open for business! Come by soon and check out the prayer labyrinth in the back of the lot across East Avenue from the parking lot. A great place for some quiet prayer and contemplation.

**Meeting the Needs of the Community** means the Food Pantry continues to be open, and Feed Our Children has been busy all summer – and now is pondering if it continues to have a role to play depending on the school status. We are meeting needs!

**Visioning** also continues, because the future keeps coming closer! As I write this, in the next 60 hours both the Forward: Fearless and Faithful team and the Stewardship for All Seasons team will meet to consider what God is calling us to do and to be. What dreams do we have? Covid or not, God has a mission for us, and God continues to bless us that we may be a blessing to others. So ... what will that mean for us? Stay tuned!

There you go ... lots and lots still going on ... and awaiting us as we move forward. The church remains open, for business, for witness, and for service. For you, and for those around you.

But most of all, for Jesus. Because as the church, we together are the Body of Christ. And in the end, Covid doesn't have a chance!

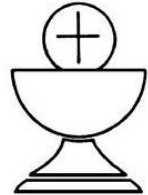


## Driveway Holy Communion



Here's how it works – **you invite us** to come to your home – we would stand safely distanced, in the driveway, as we offer a scripture reading, prayer, and Words of Institution. You would supply your own bread (of whatever kind), and

either wine or grape juice. About 10-15 minutes, and we are on our way. We will have gathered as God's people, around the gifts of bread and wine, hearing the Word and the words of promise, and sharing together a brief meal.



And ... if you have others in your neighborhood – members of Our Savior's or just those who you know are disconnected these days, they could join us, also safely distanced. Wouldn't it be just wild to have two or three family groups, all safely distanced, sharing in God's gifts of grace?

We think this will be a way to connect, even briefly, and share the sacrament with you. Maybe even a few minutes of conversation (we really do miss you all!).

# Christian Education Update



With the La Crosse County Covid compass is “severe” risk, schools are scrambling to figure out how to safely teach kids. We are doing the same! While it is critical for us to teach faith, it is equally critical

for us to do so safely, not only for the sake of our kids, but for all with whom they come in contact.

We are currently working to develop both Sunday School and Confirmation class plans. Initially we expect instruction to be online using pre-recorded videos, by our own teachers, and Zoom sessions with the whole class. We know that this will be challenging for kids, parents, and teachers, but we also know that learning isn’t really about us anyway – it’s about the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of those who yearn to experience Jesus!



If during the coming year conditions allow for a return to “in-person” classes, we will do so. Until then, however, we will work hard to make online learning as good as we can.



# First Communion Class

Due to Covid, we missed the First Communion class normally held in late March/early April. We are now looking to offer the class via Zoom in late August. Classes for *kids and parents together* will be held **Wednesdays, August 19 and 26, at 6 PM** each evening. Class will last about 45 minutes. We will send out information to parents on our list, but *if you or someone you know would be interested, please let us know!*

First Communion will be celebrated via our Zoom Sunday morning worship, which begins in August. More information will be sent out to parents. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate very different and challenging times!



## Confirmation Service *The Affirmation of Baptism*

Like so much else, Confirmation will be different! We will have the Affirmation of Baptism on **Sunday, August 30**, at the Lion's Shelter as part of a short worship service, with Holy Communion included.

How can we do that safely? We will have six worship slots, spread out over several hours, with five families at each slot. Families will bring their own lawn chairs, and bread and wine for Communion. We will take a picture of each confirmand, and then create a composite picture for the display board. We will also make arrangements for those who are unable to be with us that day.

Details are being mailed out to families, so watch for it!

## Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, July 13, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in study and prayers based on Psalm 145:15-16.
- Approved the minutes of the June 8 Meeting, and received the June financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries.
- Heard that the PPP Grant timeline has been extended, and thus the entire amount will be a grant that is used for payroll.
- Heard an update on several property issues – floors waxed, roof leaks, elevator issue, lawn mower handle.
- Formed a task force to address details for reopening building based on plan previously adopted by council, and directed the Worship Committee to design a worship experience within those parameters.
- Determined we will continue to restrict access to the building until the County Compass is down to moderate and then reevaluate at that time.
- After significant discussion, decided to provide virtual communion beginning in August.
- Discussed roof repair/replacement options and timing.
- Heard the Tech Group is researching audio and visual options to enable a better worship experience in person and on line as we move forward.
- Heard the Stewardship for All Seasons group is discussing the mission emphasis for 2021.
