Pastor's Reflections

Back to "look out!"

Someone asked me last week, "Do you have any idea when we will be able to worship together again?"

"Yeah, Easter!" The look on her face said it all!

OK, maybe before Easter, but I'm not counting on it.
Pastor Jean and I are convinced that Christmas
worship will be "virtual" this year. I had hoped that
by mid-October we could be back in the building. Then, numbers
jumped, and they haven't improved.

Of course, we can blame schools and universities, and claim they make up different circles of people. But they are also our families, the servers in stores and restaurants, and they connect with those who connect with those who connect with ... you get the idea! In short, it's still out in the community, and it's big. Even the New York Times has noticed La Crosse County. We are a hot spot!

But wait, isn't this just an overblown reaction to something that's just a hard flu? Ask the person I spoke with earlier this week. The 35-year-old daughter of a friend, who had Covid in April has been back to the ER three times – kidney issues. That's not the flu!

Or, isn't this not really all that deadly, and haven't most of the "Covid" deaths been something else? Seriously? County Medical Examiners are required to state the cause of death. Do you really think that all the county medical examiners around the country are in on some kind of conspiracy?

Or, isn't this just going to go away right after the election? Sorry, that's not happening!

We're in this, we're in it together, and we're in it for the long haul. It's a matter of life and death, and lives are being affected. True, many get the disease, and, well, it's not that much. But others — many others — are ravaged, leaving behind what appears to be life damage, and still others — 200,000 in this country alone (more than the deaths in our five last wars) — are no more. Lives lost, and loved ones shattered.



So, wear your masks, physically distance, and stay safe. For your sake, for your loved one's sake, but most of all for the sake of your neighbor. That's Martin Luther's call to faithful living (check out my pastor's blog for June 28 on our web site or my pastor's page for July – or let me know and I'll send you a copy).

But back to worship – or not. That is why we are not yet back to "in-building" worship. Yes, I know some churches are, but others have shut down again. More importantly, we are called to faithful living as disciples and as a community (that's not me talking, that's Luther, so really, read the June 28 blog or July newsletter again).

As we have said all along, the church is not closed. The building, yes, but not the church – because in the end, the church is not bricks and mortar, the church … is you! So, let's BE the church!

How? Start with worship. We are worshipping!

- Have you joined our YouTube worship? (Check out the home page of the website to access those services.) And if you can't get internet, let us know! We currently deliver 11 DVDs, with an estimated audience of about 45. We can add you to the list!
- And then there's "Zoom Communion" 25 minutes on Sunday morning. Home page of the web site, again.
- And we still do "Driveway Communions" almost 30 this summer with over 300 in attendance.

• And then...find it in this month's newsletter...the Lion's Shelter on October 11. Check that out!

Worship is happening – are you with us?

Beyond worship, Sunday School and Confirmation are happening, with a mix of virtual and outdoor "in person" experiences. Not what we want, but it's not about learning a bunch of facts — it's about forming faith. And these days it's about connecting as well as we can...and letting the Holy Spirit do the rest. Not to mention the Food Pantry, Feed Our Children, and pastoral care in a variety of ways (weddings, funerals, baptisms). The church is at work!

But wait...didn't I say YOU are the church? You are. We are doing what we can do, in ways that we have never done it, to meet a need we have never encountered. God is at work, the gospel is proclaimed, and people's lives are being changed. Right here, even in a closed building.



But...WHAT ABOUT YOU???

That's what you are doing too (I hope). Not here in this building. Instead, "out there!" That's what I meant last month, and in this month's title – "look

out." Look out there, in your little corner of the world. What do you see, what's happening around you, and what's needed? And then...what's God calling YOU to do about it!

"Look out" ...and then... "look out!" Because in the hands of the Holy Spirit, not only can you change lives, but God can (and will) change YOUR life!

So, imagine for a moment, hundreds of disciples of Jesus, in all sorts of places in our community, seeing, hearing, and responding to the needs around them. Not with their own abilities, but with the presence and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Imagine those disciples, all making a difference in the lives of others. Not changing the world, just a small corner of it.

Confirmation, pastoral care, yes, but even more ... through YOU the church is busier than ever!



Breaking news! A new worship opportunity in October...in person at the Lion's Shelter...see the article elsewhere in this newsletter for more information!

Online videos bring a message, prayers, and music. Posted by 6 PM on Saturday on YouTube, access them through our web site: www.oursaviorswestsalem.org/videos. You can watch any time, and you can even catch up on previous weeks.

DVDs are also available of our online service. If you, or someone you know, does not have the ability to watch online, but can use a DVD, let us know. Currently, we have 11 DVDs going out each week, reaching over 40 individuals – and we can do more!

Drive-way communion – we come to your house, and outdoors, safely distanced, we share a brief (10-15 minutes) worship with communion. You provide your own bread and wine/juice, the driveway, and maybe even some neighbors – we bring the Word and a message. Contact us to get on the list. We've done almost 30 over the summer – with over 300 participants! Even as the weather grows cooler, we're ready to come to your place!

Zoom Communion...join us on Sundays at 10:30 in virtual worship, using the Zoom platform. Easy to do – just head to our home page, and click on the link. Have bread and wine/juice available as we take 25 minutes to hear God's Word and celebrate the sacrament.

Come and join us in an outdoor (of sorts) worship at the Lion's Shelter, October 11. We've reserved the shelter and plan a series of physically distanced, safe-space worship together!

Worship will be held at several times, with a limit of 50 at each



service. **Reservations are required, as are masks,** and "bring your own chair."

We currently have two times for worship, but if there is enough interest, we will add more!

Here are the details:

- **Sign up** online **OR**...contact the church office!

- Directions (if you need them) are posted on our church web site home page.
- More times will be offered if there is enough interest, so if time slots are full, watch for more slots to be added.
- Worship (initially) is set for 9 AM and 10 AM.
- Worship will last about 30 minutes.
- **Bring your own lawn chairs.** When you arrive at the shelter, look for an "X" on the floor, and cluster your family around that "X" to allow for distancing from other family groups.
- Bring your own bread and wine/grape juice for communion. To avoid contamination, we will NOT be able to provide you the elements.
- Remember that masks are required for your health and for the health of those around you!

An added bonus...*the pictorial directories will be available!* Worshipers will be the first to get their copies.

Feed Our Children Summer Lunch

As, the final thank you letters of the season are placed in the mail, the Feed Our Children Summer Lunch Committee

has so much to be thankful for. After a second and third count we served around 957 lunches, provided the BGC with over 860 snack portion servings as they had strict restrictions on food prep as well as 215 bags of groceries. This is in addition to the bags of groceries that were picked up or delivered in the spring.

There were more than 100 volunteers who prepared food, served the vehicles at drive up and delivered meals and groceries to homes. We partnered with volunteers from the Presbyterian Church, Prince of Peace Lutheran, St Leo's Church, Thrivent Financial (thanks to Connie Pinski and Lynette Ender's memberships), the National Honor Society, 1st Community Credit Union and the West Salem Food Service staff.

Donations of food, serving products, and money came from all over the community. What we received from insurance agencies, churches, service organizations, local businesses, and individuals (including an anonymous donation of over \$1,000) almost completely paid for absolutely everything we needed this year. There was even a community individual who sewed masks, sold them, and donated all of the profit. We did use a little of our reserve from last year, but we still end the year in excellent standing in case we need to prepare to serve again earlier than expected. Anything that was left over went to the Food Pantry and BGC, and non-perishables such as sandwich bags were packed up for next year. Nothing was wasted.

On a personal note, I am always humbled by the generosity and support of those at Our Savior's and our West Salem Community for this program, as well as other things that I am a part of. However, this year was extraordinary. This year has been like nothing we have ever seen. There were moments that even seemed somewhat hopeless. Some days were dark, literally and figuratively. As I looked at starting this season (and guite a bit early), I was fearful of how difficult this could be. But then it began ... a food drive which started the grocery bag distribution generated so many items that it took care of that entire service for weeks. Then it was time to start summer planning, again – I wondered "how will we do this, who will still be willing to help during a pandemic?" There were times that I expected businesses, hurt by the shutdown, to not be able to help. Instead, they surpassed the gifts they had previously given, and there was no hesitation in their response to help. In fact, there were times that businesses and individuals came to me with what they could offer before I even had the opportunity to ask. We had more weekly kitchen leaders than any year before. In truth, organizing all of this is not a small task, but the amount of support that so many provide. in so many different ways, makes this a true gift to behold. It is truly incredible and a huge honor to be a part of.

Should the end of this year, or the beginning of the next, present us with the opportunity to serve again, we are ready. Otherwise – we will see all of the children again next summer.

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, September 14, with President Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in study and prayers based on Psalm 145:15-16.
- Heard electronic giving continues to be strong. Expenses are in line, however the line items with activity may not be as planned due to ministry being different.
- Learned about upcoming fall ministries including: an inperson worship at the Lion's Shelter on October 11, confirmation and Sunday school all on-line until further notice, a gathering for families at Vets Park on September 20, and a successful year for Feed Our Children with the potential of involvement in the fall.
- The stewardship emphasis for 2021 is being developed. Emphasis for 2020 pivoted to focus on technology issues related to continuing worship due to COVID. 2021 will pivot back to an emphasis on ministry excellence, increased youth ministry staffing and a new, alternative Wednesday worship.
- Learned the Tech Team is working on a proposal to upgrade the technology in the sanctuary to allow for a better worship experience now during COVID and for the future.
- Thermostats in the offices will be replaced.
- Learned that a fire pit was purchased for the prayer labyrinth area to be used by the confirmation groups as a way to gather the youth once a month.
- Discussed a potential savings to the Pastors' insurance line item in the budget.
- Heard the re-opening task force will be meeting soon to discuss procedures for whenever the time comes to resume in-person worship/gatherings.
