Pastor's Reflections

It's 2020 ...

The answer to everything that happened last year ... it's 2020.

It was Christmas Eve, the YouTube worship service had been recorded days earlier and was already posted on line, the 3 PM Zoom service had gone well with only one minor glitch that was fixed, and now it was time for the long awaited 7 PM Zoom service. This service had been months in the planning, tens of hours in making the preparations, and so much time looking forward to. We bundled up to brave the 5-degree temperature of the night ... long winter underwear, layers of clothes and socks, boots, two pairs of gloves, and a hat ... and we headed out to the Holthaus farm. The excitement growing as we drove down the road. We were welcomed at the barn - softly bathed in the glow of

a single light bulb, fresh hay on the ground. It was perfect! We unloaded the car – chairs, blanket, TV trays, computer and phone, communion wear, and the baby in the manger. All was prepared. We waited patiently ... our breath visible in the cold air,

waited patiently ... our breath visible in the cold air, the soft mooing of the cows filling the quiet night. And, now the time had come ... the congregation was gathering – smiling faces and names began to appear on the screen. We were together at last. We heard Eric sing "O Holy Night", Pastor Jon welcomed all, I read from Isaiah, we heard Lynette begin to sing "O Come All Ye Faithful", and then ... then the screen went black ... the computer that had been full of life (and battery power) was dead, lifeless, and showing no signs of resurrection. This beautiful worship service, on Christmas Eve, in the barn with the Baby Jesus, was done. No more Christmas hymns to sing along with, no Gospel reading and message, no Holy Communion ... all of the work, all of the planning, all of the anticipation and joy of sharing ... gone ... dreams dashed and spirits deflated ... there was only darkness. Mother Nature vs. technology and Mother Nature came away as the spoiler. It's 2020!

But the baby was born, the Word became flesh and dwells among us. Yes, dwells. Jesus was still born, in that barn long ago, quietly amongst the animals, with no fanfare, and unlike our technology that died in that holy moment, Jesus still lives on and dwells among us.

It's 2020 and Jesus still dwells among us. There may have been a lot of things in 2020 – too numerous to recall, and felt by each and every one of us – that went wrong, that didn't go as planned, that made us feel inadequate and unprepared, that changed our lives forever, that caused havoc in our world, but ... the baby, Jesus, still came that night in the manger, and is still ever-present with us these days of darkness and uncertainty, bringing us light and life.



It's true we blame 2020 for a lot of the darkness, but in the light of Jesus, 2020 was not all bad.

There was much learning that occurred (no one was spared – young and old alike learned something) ... we learned how to be flexible, how to pivot on a moment's notice ... we learned new ways to do familiar thing ... we learned how to be creative ... we learned new skills, like how to use technology and many different forms of technology ... we learned how to connect with people without being in the same room ... we re-learned how to write real letters, how to send note cards and greeting cards, and how to talk on the telephone ... we learned to connect with people using technology that was only an innovative "dream of the future" in a display at the Museum of Science & Industry (in Chicago) way back in the '60's where you could actually see someone in their home (the visual being a woman in her nightgown with cream on her face and curlers in her hair!) ... we learned the value of being together with family, the value of friends, the value of kids being in school to get the most of their education, the value of touch, the value of seeing the expression on someone's face, the value of interpersonal encounters and relationships ... we learned to appreciate God's creation of nature and the beauty that surrounds

us ... we learned to appreciate time ... maybe, dare I say, we even learned to appreciate church, our faith, and the community of the faithful that gathers here in this place called Our Savior's Lutheran Church ... It's 2020!

As these last months have dragged on, we are reminded that God is in charge. God created people - scientists and those in healthcare - who have worked diligently, selflessly, to care for us during these dark days of pandemic, and who have discovered a vaccine that will hopefully help us see the taming and ultimately the end of this deadly disease. But, in the meantime, we are reminded to dig deeply and find that patience we have learned this year. *It's 2020!*



We are also reminded to be "good" Lutherans ... good Lutherans who have heard the words and taken to heart the example of Martin Luther from long ago when he lived through the 1527 Black Plague. Martin Luther's advice, as he lived it centuries ago, is that we follow the science, we

care for our neighbor, we protect ourselves, but most of all we protect our neighbor. We protect our neighbor! As hard as that has been – not worshipping together in person, wearing a mask that is annoyingly uncomfortable, not gathering with family and friends, postponing celebrations of milestones in life, only leaving home for necessary outings, avoiding crowded places, not traveling, and the list goes on – we are protecting our neighbor (and ourselves). We protect our neighbor today, so we will have a neighbor tomorrow. It's 2020!

In the Eighth Commandment, God speaks about how we are to treat our neighbor, and in Luther's explanation of that commandment he tells us "we should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation", and we can add ... or endanger them with our careless, selfish activities regarding Covid, "but [we should] defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way", and by our actions do all we can to protect them from this deadly disease. It's 2020!

In everything we do, we find Jesus, the baby in the manger, the Word made flesh, at the heart of it ... even if it's 2020!

We have entered 2021 ... 2020 is now hindsight ... We go forward carrying the same brokenness, hurt, and pain that we had last year, but we also go forward having learned lessons and confident we are not going alone. We go forward in the presence of the baby Jesus, who will grow into the Jesus of the cross and the empty tomb, the Jesus who promises us new life.

Annual Meeting

After considerable discussion, the Congregation Council has decided to delay the 2021 Annual Meeting. At the present time the council believes this is the best option. We do have the ability

to hold a virtual meeting but would prefer not to meet in that manner. Instead, we hope at some point in the next six months a meeting can be held in person and safely, either in the building, or, believe it or not, outdoors!

Until a meeting can be held, the council will operate with the current budget framework. The additional ministry goals for 2021 will be added into a new budget at that time. In addition, council members whose terms are scheduled to end have agreed to serve until their successors are elected, as directed by the constitution.

While the council acknowledges the importance of the annual meeting, it also believes that the meeting is best held in person, where the congregation can prayerfully and faithfully work together to further the ministry of Our Savior's.

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, December 14, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in study and prayers reflecting on the gifts we have given and received.
- Approved the minutes of the November Council Meeting, and received the November financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries, including some collaboration between Feed Our Children, the Community Assistance Fund, and the Teachers Association.
- Heard that the entire amount of the PPP Grant has been converted to a grant rather than a loan, as expected.
- Discussed the Norwegian Dinner appeal, and voted to set aside \$4000 from the PPP Grant to augment the amount donated to community organizations.
- Heard an update on the tech project.
- Adopted a Continuing Resolution enabling a virtual congregational meeting if needed.
- Designated the pastors' housing allowance for 2021.
- Decided to give a small gift to regular employees not currently engaged in work due to Covid.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, January 11, at 7 PM via Zoom. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Steve Ahles or one of the pastors.
