Pastor's Reflections

March 15. Our last "in building" worship. With the exception of a few very small (less than 15 in attendance) weddings, baptisms, and funerals, there have been no times of Word and Sacrament,

no songs of joy or sorrow, no gatherings of the Body of Christ. No public gatherings to give thanks to a good and gracious God.

Still, we have sought to be faithful, even with Covid breathing down our necks. We have carried on ministry with a variety of virtual worship experiences, and when the weather allowed, a variety of outdoor worship services. Confirmation and Sunday School have continued, albeit in a new and strange format. People have been connected, and prayers have been lifted up. The Food Pantry and Feed our Children have been busy meeting needs. The Norwegian Dinner didn't happen, yet thanks to your generosity, we reached out to make a difference. The Mission Endowment Fund still made its gifts to the community and beyond. And lots more.

We even have a new member, and a few other families ready join us when we are able to be back together.

That's all fine and good, but as we approach the one-year anniversary of a very different time of life and ministry, just when will we get back to our building?

Interestingly, this year is the centennial of the sanctuary. On July 10, 1921 the sanctuary was dedicated. Who knew that a hundred years later, despite a vibrant and active ministry, the building would be cold, quiet, and empty?



Now, I know many businesses and other venues are open, and even more open than they were months ago. But I also know that the virus is still there. It's not going away. Not yet. Besides, the church is different. Hansen's can be at 25% or 50% capacity, and there's still plenty of room to maneuver. But our building, and our activities are tight. That still puts us together, close, too close. And we sing – do you know how many viruses can come out of the mouth during just one verse of "How Great Thou Art?"

Most of all, as a church we understand that there is more to this than just "when can I get back." *It's also about our calling and our responsibility to care for our neighbor*. Martin Luther, in his explanation to the Fifth Commandment ("Thou shall not kill"), makes it clear that we keep the commandment when we neither endanger or harm our neighbor. I like that commandment, so I wear my mask. And we stay away from worshiping together.

But there is good news – the vaccine is out! Pastor Jean and I are in Wisconsin's "1A" group (not sure we should be, but we are), so we've had our first shot – second coming in early March. Some of you have also had your vaccine, and others will be coming in the months ahead. The tide is turning, and the time is coming to be back together. Just not yet.

But if not yet, when? When will we be back in the building? I don't know. And given that things seem to change, sometimes rapidly, I'm not sure when I will know...for sure. But we do have a goal and a direction. And the beginnings of a plan.

So, here's what we are thinking...

We have reserved the Lion's Shelter for the 2nd and 4th Sundays of June-July-August, along with the fifth Sunday of August ("Gospel on the Green"). We plan to worship those



Sundays at the shelter, with no concern over the numbers – we'll just make sure to distance as needed. We're also planning for our Annual Meeting on June 13 - at the Lion's Shelter, of course!

Meanwhile, we will continue to produce weekly YouTube worship videos, and continue our Zoom worship on Sunday mornings. We will continue that until we have completed a hoped-for tech project that will allow us to "Livestream" and record worship each week.

And then...*and this is a goal not a plan*...we hope that by September we can gather again in the building, safely, without a restriction on numbers, or a need to "sign up" to worship. Maybe the first Sunday back (September 12???) we can even party together! Wouldn't that make for a fabulous "Rally Day?"

I know this is long, and September is still far off. We thought this would be a few weeks, then a few months, and instead it will be more than one year. You are disappointed – so are we – *we miss you dearly!* We miss the voices, the smiles and laughter, the pitter patter of children's feet, and the energy and excitement that you all bring. We want you back!

But remember...we have a responsibility to care for our neighbor. Moreover, remember that we have not been separated. *In the care of God's Holy Spirit, we are still together in the Body of Christ.*

And remember that the church has never shut down – because as a community we have continued to proclaim hope in a variety of ways, but most of all because YOU are the church, and *wherever you are*, *there the church is open for business!*

I am also aware – very aware – of the generosity of so many of you in maintaining your support of our work together, even when that work needed to take on a very different shape. *Thank you for your ongoing support of our work together!* As a community of faith, we have been blessed by you!

Finally, a HUGE thank you to our Congregation Council, and especially to Steve Ahles our president, for their thoughtful, prayerful, and faithful leadership during this time. So much of what we have done has been due to their insight and wisdom. God is at work in our council!



So, please continue to watch for updates as the calendar moves forward, the vaccines roll out, and God calls us to continued faithful service. And know that God is always with us!

Scholarships

As the school year continues, time to be thinking about high school graduate scholarships! Current

high school seniors at Our Savior's are eligible to receive a one-time scholarship, which can be as high as \$750. Information will be mailed shortly to seniors, or check out the web page at www.oursaviorswestsalem.org/youth-andfamily. Applications will be due April 30, with awards announced later in May.

Emphasis in the scholarships will be on involvement in the work of the church, and how students have lived out their faith. Scholarships come from a variety of sources, including the Michelson and Marking Scholarships.

A change this year is with the Lewis-Meyer Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to a current college freshman who has connected with a faith community, or maintained active connections with Our Savior's. Due to the difficulties with the pandemic, that scholarship will be delayed for one year.

Finally, a reminder that there are some scholarship funds available for non-traditional students, such as second career, or courses taken to enhance one's career. There is no set deadline on applying for this scholarship.

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, February 8th, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in conversation and reflection around the quote from Dietrich Bonhoeffer in "Life Together" ... "God taught us to meet one another as God has met us in Christ."
- Approved the minutes of the January 11 Council Meeting, and received the January financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries.
- Heard the Forward, Fearless, and Faithful team will be sending Valentines to every household in the congregation.
- Heard that we received the other proposal on the tech project, however it is missing components we need, so they are being asked to resubmit their proposal with the additional items.
- Heard the Pastors' goals for re-opening and instructed them to share with the congregation in the March newsletter. The Lion's Shelter has been reserved for the 2nd and 4th Sundays of June, July, and August, in addition to the 5th Sunday in August, for in-person worship this summer.
- Discussed possibility of allowing small groups back in the building, and the protocols and requirements that must be followed.
- Set the date for the Annual Congregational Meeting for June 13 to be held at the Lion's Shelter.
