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Pastor's Reflections

July 10, 1921. I wasn't there. I missed it.

July 10, 2021. I was there. I still missed it.

On July 10, 1921 a large crowd gathered inside Our Savior's Lutheran Church in West Salem. They gathered in the midst of new construction, maybe still bearing the scents and aromas of fresh wood and paint. Maybe a few unfinished details, a few items yet to be "nailed



down." But done enough for the people of God to worship. It was time to dedicate this new building.

In thanks to a gracious God, they did just that. Just a few years earlier two congregations – one worshiping at Leonard Street and East Avenue, the other out on County M by the Michelson farm, took the bold step to come together, to set aside both their different congregational cultures and their buildings, and to become one. To become ... Our Savior's!

I'm pretty certain it wasn't always easy. Coming together like that never is. But Spirit led, it happened. And in the fullness of time, it happened successfully. Two congregations literally building a future together. In fact, the building itself represented the meshing and melding of God's people. Materials from the two buildings, one in town, the other on M, were used on the new building. I'll bet you never knew that we have a recycled sanctuary!

We missed all that. We missed it 100 years ago, and we missed it just a few weeks ago.

Several years ago, I took note of that anniversary, and put it on my calendar. As the years unfolded I transferred the

date to the newer calendar, until this past December when I placed it on my calendar for 2021 – and it was even a Saturday, a time of worship!

Alas, Covid continued to get in the way. As did a root canal. No, not mine, but Pastor Jean's. While we couldn't do some kind of celebration like I thought a few years ago, I did think we could lift it up, at least mention it. But when July 10 rolled around Pastor Jean was suffering from an infection connected to a root canal, and loving husband that I am, that was on my mind, not the anniversary. And no, it's not her fault!

So, I'm bummed that I missed it. Of course, I can keep placing it on my calendar ... and transferring it from year to year ... Google says July 10, 2121 will be a Thursday. Mark it down – big 200th anniversary party! Maybe Covid will be gone by then ...

On the other hand, however, maybe it's not so bad. After all, what's a building? Now, don't get me wrong – I love our building. But it is just that – a building. A building that has stood on this corner for now over 100 years. It really is a big deal ... and it really isn't.

It's a big deal because the building is our presence in this community. We aren't going anywhere. We are staying put. We have made a commitment here – and we continue that commitment. Moreover, this building is a resource for us as we carry out our ministries. Think for a moment of all the worship, classes, gatherings, counseling sessions, funerals, weddings, and all other ministries that occurred in the midst of torrential rains, blinding snows, or frozen temps. Not moments for the great outdoors, at least not for church work. And all possible because the building stood firm.

But ... it's still just a building.

So now, think about the last 100 years, and all that has happened since July 10, 1921. Economic turmoil, war, political uncertainty, terrorism ... and in the lives of individuals...hurt, pain, and illness, the loss of loved ones, the growing up, and sometimes the breaking up of families, the hard times and really tight budgets.

Through all of that the building was here, but hardly much help. It was not the building, but in the ministries that proclaimed hope through the crucified and risen Jesus. There, in the gospel, for 100 years has been the message of life. Life, not because of a building, but because of Jesus, and made known by people, the people who happened to gather in this building.

But even more – think of how this gathered community faithfully proclaimed that message despite all that has gone on around us for 100 years – despite wars, hot and cold ... despite depressions and recessions ... even in the midst of uncertain times ... and even in the face of Covid ... the message has been shared. And again, not because of the building – because of the Holy Spirit moving us to share the good news of Jesus!

So, let's think about this building, after 100 years, in two ways. First, as a resource. As our world continues to change, but also as we hope to resume a more normal life, how do we use this resource, provided to us by a gracious God through the hands of those who have gone before us? How do



we faithfully embrace, protect, but also use this resource wisely to change lives and proclaim God at work?

And second, let's use it as a reminder that even in the toughest of times, God is still with us. That even 100 years of challenge cannot keep the gospel from bringing life and

hope to us ... and to a troubled world around us. The next time you see the building, whether it's driving by, or stepping inside, ponder for a moment the sign that this building shares – the sign that even now, in a still uncertain world, God – Jesus – the good news – still remains, still brings life, and still overcomes all fear!

And empowered by all of that – let's continue to move forward into the next 100 years, doing what the folks at Our Savior's have always done – proclaiming life and hope, making a difference and changing lives, living faithfully inside the building – and out!

"Returning to Normal" News

Some recent changes in our worship life mean that masks are no longer required for those who are vaccinated. If you are not yet vaccinated we urge you to do so, and to also remember that children and persons with certain underlying health conditions cannot yet be vaccinated, so please be sensitive to them.

Sign-ups are also no longer required, though we will continue to practice distancing. We ask worshipers to sign in upon arrival should there be a need for contact tracing.

At this writing (mid-July) there are growing concerns about another surge of Covid related to the Delta variant. Will that force us to change our practices? Maybe...but the best way to avoid that is to increase the vaccination rate. And if we need to, we will return to safer practices.

We are also looking forward to the fall and considering how education and faith formation, through Sunday School and Confirmation, can best take place. We will continue to monitor the pandemic and ALWAYS place the safety of our children at the top of our list!

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, July 12, in "hybrid" fashion, with most gathering in

person at church, while two members (for reasons other than Covid!) joined via Zoom. In the absence of elected officers, Pastor Jon called the meeting to order. At this meeting:

- Joined in discussion and devotions on our experiences of church that have been affirming, and experiences that have reflected our brokenness and failure.
- Participated in an orientation to the tasks and responsibilities of the council.
- Elected officers for 2021-2022 President (Jen Linse), Vice President (Jaime Fortier), Secretary (Carolyn Karl).
- Approved the minutes from the May meeting, and the annual meeting in June, and received the May and June financial reports.
- Heard that Pastor Jon and Pastor Jean will be taking vacation time in August.
- Heard updates on ministries in the congregation.
- Discussed the ongoing re-opening of the building and worship.
- Heard that the tech project is underway, but due to global supply issues, may not be complete until November.
- Approved a re-landscaping of the Leonard Street side of the building at a cost not to exceed \$5,000.
- Heard that the church rental property ("Johnson South") is now rented, but that a new water heater needed to be installed.
- Received 2021 Confirmands as voting members.
- Discussed some ongoing ministry needs and initiatives, including youth ministry support, property ministry, and a new ministry exploration team.
