

Established in 1986, the **Agricultural Museum** houses an eclectic collection of antique equipment and unique artifacts.

1. The **Trapper's Cabin** pays homage to the region's fur trade.

2. The **School House** is a faithful reproduction of a circa 1905 classroom created with antique pieces from an area school.

3. Inside **Community Hall**, local artisans offer hand-made items and locally produced foodstuffs. The Hall is also available for rental.

4. The **Blacksmith Shop** is a working recreation circa 1920. The smith specializes in hand-forged knives.

5. The **Fairbanks-Morse Diesel Engine** weighs 80 tons. It powered a tugboat and, in its heyday, was capable of producing 3,000 hp at 200 revolutions per minute.

6. The **Murphy Diesel Engine** once powered a Northwest Crane.

**Community Chapel** offers visitors a place for quiet contemplation and is a popular wedding venue. Join us for Christmas Eve and Easter morning services.

The **General Store** is named after I Stephenson & Co, a large sawmill operation in the 1800s. Inside you'll find antiques, candy, pickles, Coke, teasots, and much more.

7. Need a trim? At **Dean's Barber Shop** the stylist cuts your hair any way you want it as you relax in a vintage barber chair.

8. Stop by the **Granary** and pick up your favorite baking grains and flours. Fresh baked goodies and home-made condiments are also available.

9. At **CC's Creations** you'll find a variety of homemade and heart-warming gifts.

10. Stop by our 1930s style **Scoop and Float Ice Cream Shop** for cold treat.

11. During most events, the **Infirmary** is staffed with medical professionals. **In case of emergency during an event, call 906-420-6595.** The Infirmary also serves as our Lost and Found center.

Explore the history of railroads in the U.P. at **Belongie Station**. The Upper Michigan Central Model Railroad Club shares the many diverse aspects of model railroading.

12. The **Textile Building** highlights traditional arts such as sewing, quilting, and other fiber crafts. Stop by for an Interactive rag rug making demonstration.

13. Inside the **Telegraph Office** you can trace the history of communication from 19th century telegraph equipment to modern ham radio.

14. At the **Fiber Boutique and Candle Shop** you'll find hand-spun and dyed yarns, knit and felted items, and handmade soaps and candles.

15. Stop by the **Rock Shop** to learn about minerals and see a rock drill in action.

16. At **The Woolly Sock**, you'll find beautiful hand-crafted yarns, hats, scarves and soap.

17. In the **Pottery Shop**, you'll see the ancient art of throwing pottery on the wheel. A variety of beautiful functional pieces are for sale.

18. See the **Shingle Mill and Rock Crusher** in action during our annual show.

Our **Saw Mill** was made by the Standard Saw Mill Mchy Co. and has a 1869 patent date. Once used in Rapid River, Michigan, it has been a part of our annual show since 1977.

19. Our **Garden** combines flowers and vegetables in an informal manner. You'll also find several heirloom plantings around the Village

20. See the **Planing Mill** in action during our annual show.

Powered by a 3 hp Witte engine, our reciprocating-style **Drag Saw** trims logs to length for the saw mill.

21. **Escanaba Knit & Stitch** showcases vintage knitting and sewing machines. Stop in for a demonstration.


The **Cook Shack** serves up soups, sandwiches, and frybread.

22. The **Patriot Memorial** honors two soldiers who once owned land that would eventually become part of the UP State Fairgrounds.

23. Have a seat in our **Gazebo**. It honors Richard Ostrander, a past director of the UP State Fair.
